FROM RABBI ANNA BOSWELL-LEVY... “WHERE ARE YOU FROM?”

On September 30, Josh and I closed on our first house. Needless to say, we are very excited – especially at the prospect of not moving again for a long while! The home is in Huntingdon Valley, which may seem far away because it’s not Bucks County, but in reality it’s just 20 minutes away from Newtown. We are looking forward to being able to have you over when we get moved in and set up.

Josh had owned a home before, but for me, it’s the first house I will have ever lived in. My parents have actually never owned a house, and I grew up in various apartments in various places – Texas, Israel, New York City. I think they wanted to buy a home at some point, but they never felt secure enough in one area.

So, the ubiquitous, seemingly simple question, “Where are you from?” has never been easy to answer. I have always yearned to feel a sense of rootedness and deep connection to a place, its people, and its culture. Whenever I have moved to a new place, I think to myself, “Is this my home?” And while I have felt and do feel a sense of home in many of the places I’ve lived, I’ve always had to leave. It’s been sad knowing those places couldn’t wholly be my home.

I think about the idea of “home” a lot. What makes a home, and how does one finally come to know that a particular place is home? I know many people who never intended to live in an area for as long as they have. They didn’t set out to make that place their home; it slowly just grew on them, like vines covering a wall. Or, they still don’t feel that where they currently live is their true home — their heart is elsewhere, but life took them in other directions, away from home.

Yehuda Halevi, the medieval Spanish poet, wrote of Jerusalem, “My heart is in the east, and I am in the uttermost west.” Halevi lived most of his life in Spain, which at that time was experiencing a golden age of creative thinking and development for the Jewish com-

munity. Yet he yearned to be in the land of Israel. He finally made the long journey there, only to perish soon after he arrived.

Where is home for you? Does it reside in a particular location, or can it be found with a particular person or people? What do you need to have in a home? For Halevi, all of what he had in Spain — community, renown, opportunities to study and write, comfort — all these were not enough. Home for him was connection to God through the fulfillment of the mitzvah to live in the land of Israel, no matter what the personal sacrifice.

I write this during the last days of Sukkot, a holiday which encourages us to come out of the safety of our houses and live as much as possible in a temporary, delicate structure. It is striking to me that Sukkot always occurs when the air is getting cooler and leaves start changing. Living in the sukkah invites us to be connected to our vulnerabilities, and to find out what truly makes us strong. The sukkah teaches me about what home is truly about: that home is not necessarily found in strong walls, but in a strong heart. Home is a place where a person finds loving and fulfilling relationships – to other people, to one’s personal expression, to the Life of the Universe.

In America, our economy is built upon the housing market — our sense of wealth is very much connected to the idea of ownership and permanence. As I prepare to invest a great deal of my resources and energy into this new house, Sukkot comes as a healthy reminder to me to remember and wonder anew about what truly makes a home.

As we remember standing in the sukkah this year, let us ask ourselves, “Where are you from?” And, this new year, may we find ourselves answering the question in new ways.
