## FINDING BLESSINGS

I really struggled with what to write about this month. The trouble is not for a lack of subject matter, what with all the monumental changes happening in the world and pressing issues that face us today, but my heart and mind keep coming back to my primary and personal focus this past month: the health of our dog Thor.

Thor is a big dog with a big heart, and a lot of personality. Growing up, I was never a dog person — in fact, I was petrified of them — so it stands to reason that I fell in love with a guy who happened to have a 175-pound Dane-Mastiff mix. I was nervous about it at first, but Thor easily won my heart, and I have never looked back.

Thor turned 10 years old on April 1st, a tremendous accomplishment for a giant breed. Dogs that size usually only live for 6 to 8 years. In the past year or so, Josh and I have moved from being afraid of losing him to simply being grateful for all the time we've been able to have with him.

But the month of April was hard — really hard. Soon after his triumphant birthday, Thor suffered some kind of cardiac event. We rushed him to the emergency vet hospital in Langhorne, where he spent a lot of quality time. In the end, his heart turned out to be good and strong, but his legs, already weak, decided that they

could no longer support his weight.

Talking with people — family, friends, members of Tzedek v'Shalom — we know we are not alone in the tough decisions that face us. There is a place in our hearts that a beloved pet fills that no human can quite reach. And when a pet cycles towards the end of its life, we have a unique and challenging responsibility to this creature who is devoted to us and is completely entrusted to our care.

There is a blessing for children, traditionally bestowed by parents to their children on Friday night, which goes like this:

For a boy: *Y'simcha Elohim k'Ephraim u'Menashe* — May God make you like Ephraim and Menashe. (These were Joshua's sons, and the first sibling pair not known to have quarreled.)

For a girl: *Y'simech Elohim k'Sarah, Rifka, Rachel, v' Leah* — May God make you like Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah.

This formula is then followed by the priestly blessing, which asks God to guard and bless the children, to shine God's light on them, and to grant them peace.

While in rabbinical school, as a single person without children, I adapted the opening line of this blessing

for my cat, and then later created a version for dogs. Even though our pets are not our progeny, imbued with the hopes we place in future generations, they are our companions and household members and thus are worthy of a blessing that acknowledges them and values them. The blessings go like this:

*Y'simchaly'simech Elohim k'aryat Yehudah* — May God make you like the lion of Judah.

*Y'simchaly'simech Elohim k'Kalev ha'ne'eman*  
— May God make you like Caleb the faithful one.

There is a double, even a triple, meaning to the name Caleb. The man Caleb was one of the original twelve spies to case out the land of Israel at Moses's behest. Unlike ten of the other spies, he (and fellow spy Joshua) gave a favorable report of the land of Israel. Everyone else was too afraid of its magnificence, and they were severely punished for their lack of faith in God, who was giving them this land as a home.

But even though Caleb is a lovely name for an admirable figure, in Israel today boys are rarely given the name because it sounds too much like the word for dog

— *kelev*. How perfect for use in a blessing for dogs, then, especially as dogs are not mentioned in the Torah. (Cats aren't either, but lions are — most famously in Jacob's blessing to his son Judah which likened him to a young lion. Thus, the tribe of Judah came to be symbolized by a lion.)

In addition, the name Caleb sounds like "*ka-lev*" meaning "like a heart." As I reflect on Thor's life (first with Josh, and then both of us) and his gentle, loving and wise nature, I realize how much "like a heart" Thor is, and how he has taught me to love more graciously and unstintingly.

Whenever we utter a blessing, whether for our pets, our children, a holiday, or over a meal, it gives us the opportunity to reflect on how we ourselves are blessed to grow by being in relationship — to know gratitude and humility in the holy exchange of giving and receiving. To paraphrase the poet Faith Rogow, "When we bless, so we are blessed."

May we truly know the blessings in our lives, and have the honor of blessing them.

## Re-Use Your Shoes

A newly founded Bucks County organization is collecting used shoes to pass along to those in need.

Re-use Your Shoes, a new effort founded by Bucks County resident Kevin Kane, is putting those unused shoes on feet that need them. The organization, which was started just this fall, has drop boxes for unwanted shoes throughout Bucks County, including each location of First National Bank.

Re-use Your Shoes collects all types of shoes, including sneakers, dress shoes, and boots. Once collected, Kane and his team of six volunteers pass the shoes along to a handful of area organizations that aid people in need.

Beneficiaries include the Bethesda Project, a men's homeless shelter in Philadelphia, and the Laurel House, a sanctuary for female domestic abuse victims and their children located in Norristown. Additionally, Libertae, a program that helps women transition to the work force after overcoming drug addiction, receives dress shoes so the women have appropriate attire to wear to job interviews.

Re-use Your Shoes accepts shoes in any condition. Shoes in good, wearable shape are passed along to be used immediately by people in need. But shoes that are deemed “beyond wearable” (holes, excessive dirtiness) are donated to Nike's recycling program. Nike grinds up the soles of sneakers to make a material used for playground bases, Kane explained.
