In a world full of problems, this is a great opportunity to actually solve one. And it will be a good opportunity to get our name out into the community.

The room will be prepped ahead of time so all we need to do is show up with rollers and brushes and get to work. We're trying to see if Home Depot will give us the paint.

Background info: The shelter serves about 50–70 people who are in the process of reestablishing themselves, i.e. looking for jobs, retraining, getting counseling, and so forth. The living is communal with a Men's dorm and a Family dorm. Meals are supplied and served by volunteers (yet another opportunity). On January 1, 2012, Family Service Association took over ownership of the shelter from the American Red Cross. Family Service had been involved when the shelter opened in the late 1980s, when it provided case management services. The organization assists vulnerable populations in its many programs and has a comprehensive menu of services that will help those who come to the shelter to move from homelessness to self-sufficiency. FROM RABBI ANNA BOSWELL-LEVY...

CONNECTING WITH ISRAEL

I want to commend Eve Lifson on publishing her thoughts and internal struggles concerning issues on peace and justice in Israel in the Tufts University paper and in our May newsletter. I know that for myself, growing up as a liberal Jew who saw firsthand the tensions in Israel between Israelis and Palestinians, and between religious and secular Jews, I struggled to identify my feelings about what I witnessed, much less find the words to describe them.

In Israel there is an active dialogue about these issues; in the U.S. these arguments are largely squelched. It is particularly troubling that many Jews today feel that the synagogue is no place to talk about Israel except to assert our loyalty to the land and modern state of Israel. If we can't talk about our concerns and fears for Israel in our synagogues, where can we?

Synagogues should be safe places for Jews to hash out their challenges and work through their struggles, whether it be about Israel, Torah and holy texts, God, loss and grief, or issues of social justice. Synagogues need to be places where we listen to one another and help each other mature and develop along our Jewish paths.

In the last month we have celebrated Israel Independence Day, the Day of Remembrance for Israel's fallen soldiers, and Jerusalem Day (the day Israel won the Six-Day War which united Jerusalem). There was a passionate piece in *The New York Jewish Week* by Uri Zaki, the head of the U.S. arm of the eminent Israeli human rights organization B'Tzelem, that appeared a few weeks ago. He writes, "Israel's Declaration of Independence includes two pillars upon which it stands — the creation of a Jewish national homeland under a democratic regime. Indeed, this special time of the year can elicit a narrow focus on the first pillar. Yet equally significant is the other pillar — Israel's democratic foundations.... Democracy isn't meant to be easy. It requires active engagement to function properly, so that civil rights are protected and the political process may move forward in everyone's interests."

So when Israel's Independence Day comes every year, we should celebrate it — its reality *and* its promise. As Uri Zaki put it, "When we celebrate Israel we must not omit its democracy and those who strengthen the bedrock on which it stands." Israel is not perfect, just as any country is not. What makes it imperative for us as Jews to care is that it is the Jewish homeland, and therefore represents the values and ideals of all Jews.

To be sure, there are troubling things happening in Israel. In late May, during violent protests in Tel Aviv against them, Sudanese refugees who escaped genocide in Darfur were characterized as "infiltrators" and as criminals. While there has been a growing crime wave by Africans, police and other officials have gone on record as saying that if the Sudanese were allowed to work in Israel, crimes of desperation would cease. We need to encourage Jewish organizations in North America, who represent us, to speak out against act of violence against people who are seeking refuge in Israel and remember that we are people who welcome the stranger, the foreigner, the poor. As I taught at our Shavuot gathering, according to Jewish tradition and exemplified in the book of Ruth (traditionally read at Shavuot), acts of *hesed*/kindness such as this hasten the messianic age.

When we raise our voice and remain involved, change can happen in Israel — and here is the proof: On May 30th, Rabbi Miri Gold, a Reform rabbi living and serving a community in Israel, won a six-and-a-half year long court case to require the state to pay salaries to non-Orthodox rabbis who serve communities in Israel. Israel does not have separation of church and state, and currently, only Orthodox rabbis serving congregations get a stipend from the state that is taken from a "religious tax."

This is huge step for liberal Judaism in Israel, but there is still a long road ahead. Like Eve, we must share our concern, even our confusion when we see things that disturb us. Only if we American Jews care enough to stay connected can Israel reflect the values and hopes of *all* Jews.




In Our Shul...

SUSTAINING TZEDEK V'SHALOM

As we near the end of our fiscal year, we would like to make one small, but very important, appeal for a nominal “sustaining contribution” to Tzedek v’Shalom.

As the economy has taken a toll on the country over the past couple of years, TVS has not been spared. On average, congregations across the country typically count on fundraising and donations for up to 25% of annual revenues. This helps protect them from swings in cash flow and budget. While our level of fundraising has never been that high, we too must occasionally reach out for help.

As small as we are, when times of economic hardships and/or personal situations result in the loss of even a couple of families, and when students graduate from our religious school and are not immediately replaced by incoming families, this collectively has a huge impact on us.

Make no mistake, we are committed to keeping TvS a vital Jewish Reconstructionist community, a hidden gem in Newtown, PA (just maybe not so hidden). We have renewed energy about making our school even more vibrant and attractive, reaching out to new families and the socially conscious, and refining our programming to better integrate our community.

To help us achieve this, and so that we may continue to offer programs, pay our bills, keep our religious school operating, and offer new social justice programs like supporting the Bucks County Homeless Shelter, if you are in position in the coming weeks and months to include a Sustaining Donation of \$54 per family, it would be much appreciated.
